Once again as we approach a holiday, please do the best things in life. Enjoy time with friends, family and loved ones, be happy and take care.



### GERMANY TRIP 2023

During the Easter holidays the History Department, along with 48 Summerhill students, visited three of Germany's most famous cities.

The group arrived in Munich, where we took in the scenery and retraced the events of the infamous Munich Putsch of 1923. Students were fascinated to see the places where Nazism began and immersed themselves in the cultural elegance of Bavaria. Our journey continued to Nuremberg, a picturesque medieval city that became the cultural heartland of the Nazis during the 1930s. Here, our students were able to gain an insight into the sheer ambition of the Nazis and their vision of building a 'Reich to last a thousand years'. Tour guides were incredibly impressed with both the knowledge and curiosity that our students possessed.

After eating a traditional German meal of bratwurst and sauerkraut, the group boarded a coach to Berlin. Here we visited Sachsenhausen, one of the early Nazi concentration camps. Once again, the students conducted themselves with dignity and respect whilst taking in the expertise of their tour guides. Next, we were treated to an all access tour of the Berlin Olympic Stadium (now home to Hertha Berlin football club) before soaking up the sights and sounds of 'Checkpoint Charlie'.

The students were impeccably behaved and provided wonderful company throughout the trip. Additionally, a huge thank you to Miss Lovatt, Mr Smith, Ms Stevens and Mrs McPherson for making the experience so memorable. We plan to do it all again in two years time!
