Dear Parents/Carers and Students,

It has been an absolute pleasure to be in school over the last few weeks and I am already immensely proud to be part of the Summerhill team. I have now met all of our students in assemblies and have reiterated what a great school we have and how privileged and fortunate they are to be part of such a caring and vibrant community. We will always have the highest of expectations in all aspects of school life, both on-site and in the local community. These expectations are based on traditional values and underpinned by honesty, integrity and transparency in the way we do things. Our ethos of 'Success through Caring' is the cornerstone of our community and we will continue to develop our values over the coming months and make them an intrinsic part of who we are and what we do.

Summerhill is a wonderful place to be. Our finalised 2019 exam results, which are now in the public domain, were the best in the school's history. These re-established us, rightly so, as one of the best schools in Dudley. This is testament to the commitment and dedication of our brilliant staff team and the effort and determination of our Year 11 'Class of 2019'. We were delighted to welcome them back and celebrate their success this week at our Presentation Evening, held at the Copthorne Hotel.

I have talked to our students about what I call the 'non-negotiables' of being a Summerhill student and how these positively impact the running of the school and the education they receive. Things like excellent attendance, punctuality, smart uniform and correct equipment are fundamentally important and need to be right every day. I have made it clear that students will be challenged where they are not meeting these things. We need to be relentless in our drive to make further improvements and excel in all we do.

In the first week of November, we celebrated 'Remembrance' with the production of 16,000 poppies, which created a new 'Garden of Remembrance' at the front of the school site. We offer our grateful thanks to the local schools and parents who supported us with this. We were delighted to welcome many members of the local community into school and are so proud of our affiliation with the Kingswinford Royal British Legion. We were honoured to have approximately 50 representatives join us for our Remembrance event on Thursday 7th November and were then part of the annual parade in Kingswinford on Remembrance Sunday.

I am delighted to be able to confirm that we have now established a 'Friends of Summerhill' association. In the old days we would have referred to this as a PTA (Parent, Teacher Association) or similar. We want this to have representation across our local community, with people who are interested in working with the school and developing a programme of community activities and events. The first 'FOS' event will be a Christmas Fayre on Saturday 14th December 2019 from 11am till 2pm. If you are interested in being involved in this, please get in touch.

As I said in my first letter, I believe that a true community school is a partnership between staff, students, parents and community stakeholders. Working together, we can ensure that students enjoy school, make good progress and leave as responsible, well-qualified, mature and ready to make a valuable contribution to society.


Accelerated Reader has got off to a flying start in Year 7 and 8: students have read and quizzed 864 books, totalling with 22,813,544 words.
